ADDRESS BY THE ACTING GRAND MASTER

Calgary, Alberta,

May 13th, 1952.

To the Officers and Members of the Grand Council
of Western Canada, Royal and Select Masters.

My Illustrious Companions:

On July 3rd, 1951, our Most Illustrious Grand Master, Most Illustrious Companion George Plasteras, of Saskatchewan Council No. 6, in Regina, was called to the Grand Council Above, there to partake of Refreshment, after having been Installed in his high office a short time only. It has therefore devolved upon me, as your Grand Deputy Master, to carry on the functions of government which would otherwise have been so pleasantly and efficiently performed by that good companion with a heart of gold who has been caused to leave us. His long service in the devoted furtherance of the welfare of Cryptic Rite Masonry will always keep illuminated a bright niche in the memories of those of us who knew him best and remind us of the vast amount of building remaining to be done for these same ends. It has, therefore, been with much of humble diffidence that I have sought to carry on this work, and, in these sad and unlooked-for circumstances, companions, it will not be possible to duplicate, in all respects, the customary "Grand Master's Address" owing to the interrupted sequence. This is the first occasion, companions, that our Grand Council of Western Canada has suffered the death of a Grand Master during his office, and we can only hope that such may not occur again.

To those companions who are present at this Assembly of Grand Council today, who may not have attended previously, I extend a cordial welcome and trust you will feel free to contribute to our discussions for an ever more healthful and continual expansion of interest in the Cryptic Rite degrees amongst the real Masons in the Chapters of the Royal Arch. To those who are more fully at home here, the renewal of previous friendships and the forming of new ones will come with youth-renewing pleasure, whilst to our truly distinguished visitors from other Grand Jurisdictions we extend our most cordial greetings in welcome. We trust that this occasion may be both happy and leave you pleasant memories.

To the Thrice Illustrious Master, Officers and Companions of Zadok Council No. 3, the appreciation of this Grand Council is most heartily conveyed for their courtesy and consideration in providing, at somewhat short notice, such comfortable accommodation for this Fourteenth Annual Assembly of Grand Council, with all of the work and careful arranging that such an occasion necessitates. Fortunately, the many talented members of our largest Council, under the benevolent and much experienced eye of our Most Illustrious Companion Fred J. Hand, its Recorder, think nothing of such an unexpected happening and rather greet it as additional opportunity to play the host in customary Calgary fashion, although it is within the last month only that such decision was made.

Companions, you will all have noted the total membership pertaining to the Cryptic Rite in this wide jurisdiction as shown in the last Proceedings for December 31, 1950. Undoubtedly this will have shown considerable growth during the year following and since. Compare its figure with that of Grand Chapter membership over the same territory of Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta, and British Columbia. What is the percentage of Chapter membership, that is active in our Councils? I have recently learned of a statistical chart, compiled by one of the Western United States, of Chapter membership growth since 1936, and beside it was charted the membership percentage curve of Council's of Royal and Select Masters. Chapter growth was steadily substantial and very healthy, but the striking thing, to my eye, was the fact that Council membership stayed almost all the time within a fraction of 1% of a 20%

figure. There was variation to only a slight extent on one side or the other. So one companion out of every five who were Chapter members had come to belong to a Council of Royal and Select Masters. A nearer approach to this might be attained up here in Western Canada, if a little more enthusiastic organizing for such ends was put into being. Possibly some ardent spirit amongst our Past Grand Masters would consent to stimulate the Extension Committees of our local Councils with constructive ideas? If effort along these lines is made, results will come. It is, of course, admitted that mere numbers do not reflect the moral strength of the organization at any one time, but they will over a period of time, and providing the quality and spreading of opportunities for contact with the Work are properly attended to, numbers most certainly become of advantage. Alberta carries about a third of our present membership, and nobody complains of their quality! The rest of us have much to do to play an equal part, and I know that, as yet, in British Columbia, our membership is still as low as only one in thirty Chapter members, whilst every member waits for the next one to do something about it.

Our Lodges of Royal Ark Mariners are showing healthy growth, which is a good thing, for there is a great deal more to this degree than meets the eye at first glance—perhaps a characteristic of Masonic degrees!

Constitution of Zarthan Council, No. 7, New Westminster, B.C.

Zarthan Council, No. 7, was Constituted and Consecrated at New Westminster, B.C., on Wednesday, June 6th, 1951. The ceremony was performed by Most Illustrious Companion Melvin M. Downey, the Grand Recorder. I assisted in this ceremony, and installed and invested the Officers of Zarthan Council. The following also assisted: Rt. Ill. Comp. T. Spencer Baynes, Rt. Ill. Comp. D. This Lodge was Constituted and Dedicated to our Grand Inspector General for B.C., Rt. Ill. Comp. Rev. T. Spencer Baynes, on the evening of Wednesday, February 13, 1952, and was duly proclaimed by myself. I recommend to this Grand Council that Fraser River Lodge be granted a Charter.

I have had the pleasure of making Official Visitations to Both Zabud and Zarthan Councils on many occasions during the past year, and have found them to be showing many signs of encouraging growth amongst a high quality of membership.

Their help and guidance has been invaluable and our Most Illustrious Grand Recorder has always been a tower of strength and helpfulness.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON FRATERNAL DEAD

To the Grand Officers and Companions of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Western Canada:

We your Committee on Fraternal Dead beg to report as follows: the Grand Architect of the Universe in His infinite wisdom has summoned to the Celestial Lodge above seventeen of the members of this Grand Council. Included in this list is our present Grand Master, Most Illustrious Comp. George Plasteras, who was born in Corinth, Greece, November 15th, 1885. He came to the United States in 1901 and to Canada in 1912. He was married October 21st, 1923, and leaves to mourn his loss his widow, and daughter Helen, Mrs. George Hill of Calgary. M. Ill. Comp. Plasteras was a Past Master of Saskatchewan Lodge No. 92, Edmonton; a Past Principal of North Star Chapter, No. 2, Royal Arch Masons of Edmonton and active in Knights Templar and Red Cross of Constantine at Regina.

We also lost during the past year two Past Grand Masters, Most Ill. Comp. Charles A. Hill of Cyrus Council No. 2, Winnipeg, and Most Ill. Comp. Harold W. B. Bell, of Zadok Council No. 3, Calgary. Both these Companions came from the British Isles. Charles A. Hill was born in London, England, in 1873. He served this Grand Jurisdiction as Grand Master in 1938, being our first Grand Master. Companion Hill was active in masonry in Winnipeg, and in addition to Cryptic Masonry served the Red Cross of Constantine most faithfully. Most Ill. Comp. Harold W. B. Bell was born in Tyrie Mains, Aberdeenshire, Scotland in 1888. Was married in London, England June 23rd, 1909, to Miss Margaret Wallace who survives him. Came to Strathmore, Alberta in 1909, becoming engaged in the garage business. While in Strathmore he served Strathmore Lodge A. F. & A. M. as Master. He was exalted in Bow Valley Chapter No 10 at Gleichen. At the institution of Strathmore Chapter he was the Second Principal. He was a Life Member of Harmony Chapter at Bassano, and Golden West Chapter at High River. He was President of the Order of High Priesthood of Alberta in 1946. While a resident of Calgary he was associated with the Alberta Motor Association.

We will also miss from our Councils the following: R. Ill. Comp. George H. McKay, Comps. John S. Asson, Alexander E. Davidson, Harry Middleton, Gerald H. Sedger and Charles J. Bjerre of Zabud Council; Ill. Comps. Frederick B. Dubinsky and Benjamin S. Bailey, and Comp. John Y. Reid of Cyrus Council; Comp. M. P. Leyshom of Zadok Council, Ill. Comp. Elee J. Paulsen of Zohar Council, Comps. George E. D. Holley and A. Herbert Rowe of Alberta Council, and Comp. Cameron W. Phillips of Saskatchewan Council.

Imbued with the high precepts of masonry they were ever eager and enthusiastic in their adherence to its principles, also stalwart in their desire that the Companions might absorb the teachings of the Craft. They won for themselves a large place in the affections of masons throughout Western Canada. We think of them gratefully as we record of George Plasteras his brave warm heart. Harold Bell his energetic humorous manner, Charles Hill, his sturdy confident faith. We are indeed sorry to see these tall timbers falling one by one.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE CONDITION OF CRYPTIC MASONRY

March 31st, 1952.

To the Most Illustrious Grand Master, Officers and Companions of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Western Canada.

The reports of the Grand Inspectors General of British Columbia, Alberta, Manitoba and Saskatchewan have been carefully perused and examined, as well as the reports of the Grand Recorder, Most Illustrious Comp. Melvin M. Downey and the Grand Treasurer, Rt. Ill. Comp. Roy M. Lambertson, and your Committee on the Condition of Cryptic Masonry in Western Canada begs to report as follows:

It is most gratifying to note that a substantial increase in securing new members for the year ending December 31st, 1951, and prospects look bright for 1952. From the report on membership by our Grand Recorder, is indicated that we have honored-chosen and greeted 169 new members, one by affiliation, one restored. A total of 171 members. This number was reduced by 29, 18 by death, nine demitted and two suspended. An increase of 142, or a total membership, as on December 31st, 1951 of 708 members.

The financial statement prepared by the Grand Treasurer, R. Ill. Comp. R. M. Lambertson, and certified by the Auditor shows a revenue of \$1,007.35, and disbursements \$319.54. There was a net balance of \$2,322.23 in the Bank as at December 31st, 1951. From the following synopsis of the Grand Inspectors General, reports that the Councils are making good progress. The work of the degrees are exemplified in full dramatic form, and thus the truths and teachings of Cryptic Rite Masonry are indelibly imprinted upon the memory of those who receive the degrees. It is also evident that the officers of the various Councils realize, that to win success, they must strive to do good work in the degrees. Your committee feel confident that as long as this enthusiasm and sense of duty prevails, Cryptic Rite Masonry will ascend to still greater success in the years that lie ahead.

BRITISH COLUMBIA—Ill. Comp. Baynes, Grand Inspector General reports that Zabud Council No. 1 is suffering from a lack of interest from the older members of the Council, but reports that the present officers are anxious to perform their duties. To do so, the members of the Council should support them by their presence at the regular meetings. This Council used to be one of the most progressive in the Grand Council, and with a little more team work between the members and the officers, it should once again be a leader. R. Ill. Comp. Baynes has given a lot of his time and energy to try and improve conditions in the Council.

ZARTHAN—This Council, from the report of Inspector General, seems to be suffering from a lack of interest in the work, even amongst the officers. On the occasion of the official visit only 12 members were present, and five of the members

were from Zabud. It is the duty of the officers to see that the Companions attend on the occasion of the Inspector General visit.

ALBERTA—R. Ill. Comp. G. H. Lambert has been very conscientious in the performance of his duties as Inspector General, and his visits to the various Councils, no doubt, will increase interest in the Cryptic Rite.

Zadok No. 3 are to be congratulated on the wonderful progress they have made during the year, and are now the largest Council in Western Canada. The International visits to Councils in Montana are what keeps up interest in the work, and make for a better understanding between the Companions of Alberta and Montana.

ALBERTA PROVINCIAL COUNCIL No. 5—This Council has been promoting International goodwill visits for many years. What this old world needs most these days in that spirit of friendship and goodwill. The officers of No. 5 deserves the highest praise for the work they are doing to promote the circle of friendship.

MANITOBA: CYRUS COUNCIL No. 2—R. Ill. Comp. J. Morgan Davies reports that Cyrus at its regular Assemblies had an average attendance of 80%, which shows an interested and enthusiastic membership. This Council is fortunate in having young and enthusiastic officers. And look forward to a large increase in membership this year. Cyrus lost one of our most enthusiastic workers, in the passing of Most Ill. Comp. Charles A. Hill, whose presence was an inspiration to the officers. R. Ill. Comp. Fred Dubinsky and Ill. Comp. Ben S. Bailey. They will be sorely missed on our Assemblies.

SASKATCHEWAN—R. Ill. Comp. Harry R. Robinson reports that Saskatchewan Council No. 6 has a total membership of 116, comprised of 70 resident members, 45 non-resident and one Honorary. This Council has made good progress since it was reorganized. In degree they excel in putting on the dramatic work, and have an excellent staff of officers. They hope to have another council formed in the Northern part of the province in the near future, and your committee wish them every success in their efforts to form a new Council. This Council suffered a great loss in the passing of M. Ill. Comp. George Plasteras. His work in ritualistic and dramatic form was a wonderful portrayal of the part he was doing, and his place in the Council will be hard to fill.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON FRATERNAL RELATIONS

We, your Committee on Fraternal Relations, beg leave to submit the following:

Proceedings from the various Grand Councils throughout the World have been received, but no reviews of their activities has been written. With some Grand Councils a note of pessimism prevails. As our Grand Council is one of the new ones we are not in a position to make comparisons. During the fiscal year of 1950 the Grand Councils of the United States had a gain of 5%. Their combined membership at the end of the year was 250,222. In the same year Western Canada had an increase of 14½ %. During the ten years of our Grand Council the Councils in the United States had an increase of 62%; from 158,818 in 1940 to 250,222 in 1950.

In spite of a few decreases enthusiasm prevails throughout the Cryptic World. There appears to be a closer working arrangement between the Royal Arch Chapters and the Councils.

We have lost a number of our Grand Representatives abroad, and these have been replaced by Comp. Emmett H. Ernst of California, Comp. F.P. Kramer of New Jersey, Comp. Laverne M. Brister of New York, Comp. Edward C. Bergman of Washington, and Comp. Thomas Halverson of Wisconsin. We welcome these grand Representatives to our Grand Council and Family.

A number of our constituent councils make periodic fraternal visits to the United States, and in return entertain Companions from across the line. This creates a very happy feeling. May it long continue.
