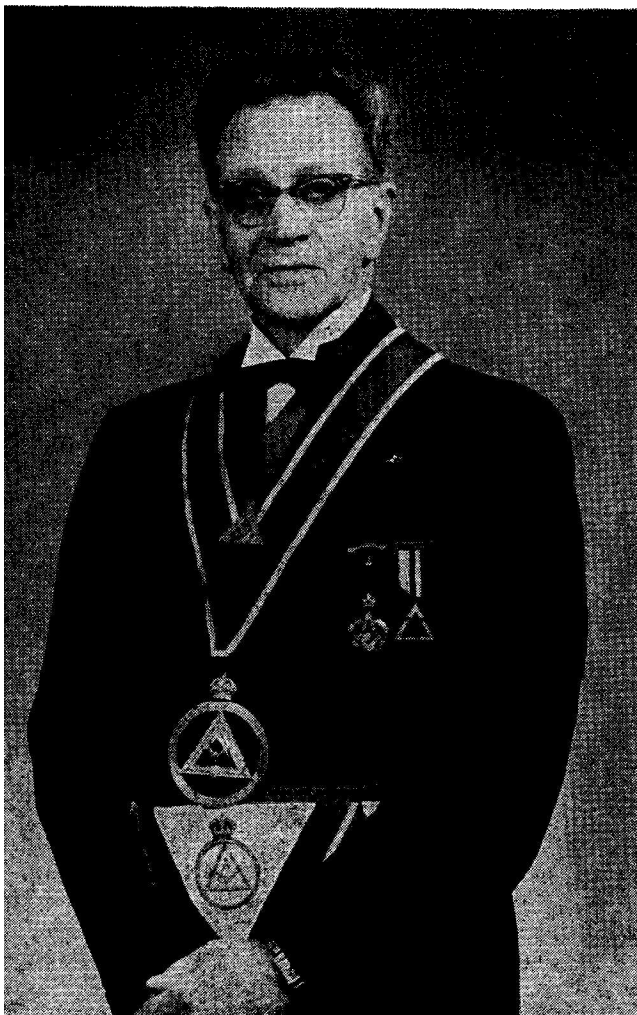

ADDRESS OF THE GRAND MASTER

To the Officers and Members of the Grand Council of Western Canada Royal and
Select Masters, Cryptic Rite of Freemasonry.

Twentieth Annual Grand Assembly. Your presence assures us of your devotion to the
Cryptic Rite and the principles for which it stands.

As your Most Illustrious Grand Master, it is with abiding courage and hope in
the future of our institution that I bid you a hearty welcome to this our Twentieth
Annual Grand Assembly, fully assured that our deliberations will be tempered with
that sense of justice and mutual goodwill which has always characterized our Annual
Grand Assemblies.

Today we are permitted to assemble in this beautiful new Masonic Temple. Let
us ask the blessing of the Supreme Architect as we meet together and pray that we
shall continue so to meet in peace, in love, and in unity.

Having previously granted issuance of a Dispensation to form this new Council, owing to my being indisposed I was unfortunately unable to be present at the Institution Ceremony.

On the evening of March 22nd, 1958, the Companions were assembled in a Vault at the Chilliwack Masonic Temple and, having instructed my Grand Inspector General, Rt. Ill. Comp. R. O. Cutler, to read to them my Dispensation and proceed with the Ceremony of Institution, which he later reported to me was carried out in a very impressive and dignified manner. R. Ill. Comp.
