At that time I promised you my best efforts, this I have done with a deep sense of gratitude to the Supreme Grand Master of the Universe for his vigilance in watching over us and in asking for his continued guidance in the future to help us carry out the plans that He has placed on the trestle board for us to follow.

You will recall that at my installation I chose as my Theme for the year, one word. "Participation", as my challenge to each of you My good Companions. I thank all responsible for this tribute and for this outstanding day of Cryptic Fellowship and Enlightenment. A very special thanks you should go to Ill. Companion Fisher and Hill for all their excellent arrangements.

I find there are a lot of areas in which we could improve upon our work, so many of our practices and usages are not clearly spelled out in our Ceremonies or in our Constitution. It is my hope that some of these points may be referred to the Chairman of the Committee on the Work, for their consideration and clarification.

I am sorry to say that a lot of our Ritualistic work is still being read out of the rituals. This practice does not enhance the beautiful story which we try to convey by ritual and drama. We have so many of our newer and younger Companions who have not been directly involved in the work of our Councils, perhaps they could be invited to participate, thus adding some new life and interest to your Degree teams. Our Ritualistic work is too beautiful to allow this to continue. It is up to everyone of us, particularly the Thrice Illustrious Masters of each Council to endeavour to improve this during their year of Leadership. Just another way of using our Theme of "Participation".

I have had no comments from any of the Companions During this past year at the suggestion of our Most Puissant General Grand Master, I felt that communication with each of our Constituent Councils was very important in order to keep them informed of what was happening at the Grand Council level. This, I initiated by sending out three letters to each of the Constituent Councils and to my officers. The first letter was sent out just prior to our return to labour in late August. A letter in which some of our plans for the year were briefly outlined. The second letter around the first part of December, in which I outlined some of the events that had taken place along with a Christmas greeting to all the Companions. The final letter was mailed to arrive early in March, mentioning some of the highlights of the year and inviting all to our Grand Assembly.

as to the worth of these Messages, and I personally know that in some cases they were not read out by our Recorders, as they felt they did not have enough time. That my Companions is one of our greatest faults, we never seem to have time for any Masonic education or for something of a constructive nature. If

that is the case, then I am disappointed with my efforts to stimulate interest and make you more knowledgeable.

Another practice which I used this year at the close of each of my official visitations, again following our General Grand Masters suggestion, and that was to close each meeting with the beautiful ceremony of the "Circle of Friendship". As we stand shoulder to shoulder with our arms crossed and hands warmly clasped, thus welding the Circle of Friendship into an unending chain of Fraternal Union. Whilst the links of this chain (individual Companion) will never again be so united, it binds us all symbolically together forever and makes this Circle stronger and more enduring than bands of steel, with the resultant forming and cementing of true and lasting Friendships. Thus our Labours about the Altars of Masonry will not have been in vain. What a beautiful way to take our leave from each other, after our Fellowship together, I commend it to each Council to continue this beautiful practice. It only takes two minutes and involves every one of the Companions and is a practical way in which they can share their Fellowship with their Companions.

The Cryptic Mason of the year award has been selected and I hope it will meet with your approval. as we honour an Outstanding Companion and dedicated Mason. His name will be revealed at the time of the presentation. He is now the third recipient of this award in our Grand Jurisdiction. Companions Roy Garnet and Stan Dunn, the two previous recipients are again with us and we salute them for their loyalty and continuing interest.

We have a notice of motion passed by my home Council and submitted to Grand Council, to change the name of this Grand Council, to that of the "Grand Council of Royal and Select Cryptic Masons of Western Canada", following the action of some of the other Grand Councils, notably California and Tennessee. The new name is to help show both the public and uninformed Masons that the Council is indeed a Masonic organization. I hope you will give this your careful consideration and approval, when it is presented to this Grand Assembly.

TO THE GRAND COUNCIL ROYAL & SELECT MASTERS OF WESTERN CANADA. Most Ill. Grand Master:

Your committee of the Condition of Cryptic Rite Masonry in Western Canada for the year 1977, is pleased to present the following report.

The reports of your Inspectors General for the districts of B.C. Mainland, Vancouver Island, Alberta, Saskatchewan & Manitoba have been received, and we find that Cryptic Masonry in Western Canada is showing great progress. Your committee is most gratified to see the abstract of returns received from our Grand Recorder which shows a net gain, in our Grand Council of 58 members. Our Royal Ark Mariners Lodges also show a net gain of 42. Your Inspectors General report they were all received at all Councils with the dignity beholding to their office as your representative. They found all the Councils in good financial standing, degree work was conferred on candidates in very able manner.

Your committee notes that only 3 Councils showed a loss this year for a total of 10 members. We had 26 members who passed to the Grand Council above.

4 of our councils showed 11 members who were suspended. We believe that every effort should be put forth before we suspend any member. We should use the same persuasion when talking to a member about to be suspended, as we do to a Royal Arch Mason whom we would like to join our Council.

It has been recommended by Rt. Ill. Comp. H. Tonkin that Zenith Council U.D., receive their charter, as they have proved themselves, that they are a progressive Council and have conferred degrees on many candidates. Rt. Ill. Comp. Wm. Schade recommends that the Charter to Portage la Prairie Council be held back until they have completed conferring degrees on some new candidates as their membership of Royal & Select Masters chiefly consists of Charter members only.

Your committee also would like to report that a joint council assembly between Saskatchewan Council No. 6, and Zophiel Council No. 13, was held Sat. Nov.5th, 1977, which was a great success, and we would like to see other districts get together, and have joint assemblies. We believe these type of "Field Dats" would attract new members, and bring out some of our non-attenders.

22 We are happy that communications between the Constituent Councils and the Grand Council have been improved by the extra letters of information dispatched by our Grand Master. However communications are and always have been a two way street. Our Councils should also take this to heart. There would appear to be little gain if our Grand Master takes the time to communicate with you, and you in turn do not even read the letter in Council. To say that you did not have time would appear, to us, as the manufacturing a lame excuse.

We congratulate our Grand Master on closing his Official visits, with the "Circle of Friendship" as this is a warm and fitting completion of an interesting evening.

We note with approval the "Notice on Motion" covering a meaningful revision to our Grand Council Title, and we feel our Companions will deal favorably with this improvement.

We have marveled at the many regular and extra curricula official visits made by our Grand Master during his term of office. We congratulate him on his extended travels and thank him for the most favorable light in which he has represented our Cryptic Rite, not only in Canada but also in that great Republic to the south of us. Such faithful and devoted service to our Order is well above that which is normally expected, and this Grand Council is most appreciative of your fine endeavors.

We have also perused the dispensations granted by our Grand Master and find all in order and well within his power to grant.

We concur in his Grand Representative appointments.

We grieve with him in the passing of our esteemed Companions who have been called to Higher Service, and we extend our sincere condolences to their sorrowing relatives.
