To the Grand Council of Cryptic Rite Masons of W. Canada.

Mt. Ill. Grand Master and Companions;

On behalf of the committee on the condition of Cryptic Rite Masonry in Western Canada, I am pleased to submit the following. The information contained in this report is taken from the G.I.G.s reports of their official visits to the Constituent Councils in their respective Districts.

It would appear that the condition of cryptic Rite Masonry in the various Districts is progressing, the exception being one Council in the Lower Mainland of B.C. A concentrated effort by the incoming G.I.G. assisted by the sister Councils should see an improvement in 1986 – 1987. In most Councils the degrees were conferred in a creditable manner and attendance was good in most cases.

Having been a recorder for the past 18 years, I sympathize with the recorder of Zaccai Council. The T.I.M. is solely responsible for the operation of his Council, aided and assisted by the Past T.I.M.s and the Officers. In the installation ceremony the duties of all the Officers is well laid out, including that of the Recorder.

The overall picture of Cryptic Rite Masonry in Western Canada is good, even though we only had an increase of 19. Details are as follows;

Councils = 19, Membership Dec. 31, 1984 = 1291, Admitted = 91, Affiliated = 16, Restored = 1, Demitted = 27, Suspended = 20, deceased = 42, membership Dec. 31/85 = 1310, Increase = 19.

## **COMMITTEE ON CHAIN COLLARS**

To the Most Ill. Grand Master, Officers and Members of Grand Council Cryptic Rite Masons of Western Canada.

The special committee appointed to study and report on the proposed adoption of gold chain collars for presiding and past Grand Masters of this Grand Council beg to report on the subject as follows.

It is our belief that the direction was to include also the standardization of the Grand Officers and Past Grand Masters jewels as at the present time there are too many variations of jewels. We are not sure how this has come about as our Constitution adequately covers the type of jewel each Officer both in Council and Grand Council are to wear. It will be only necessary to see that the present instructions are followed.

As to the gold chain collars for the 3 top officers of Grand Council we have considered and looked at several alternatives. There has been a movement for several years to have a standardized charm collar for the Eastern central and Western Canada Grand Councils so we are not alone in this matter.

Consideration was given to the adoption of Gold Chain Collar in use by our Comps. American Grand Councils. That collar, we note, is basically the same as the Royal Arch Masons with a trowel added over top of the keystone and over the mallet and chisel Etc. Wherever they appear on the collar. We have a copy of the collar if anyone wants to see it.

Your Committee feels two things about this;

1. We should have a more distinctive Canadian collar.
2. That it is a desecration of the Royal Arch collar.

We have looked at and have a collar which is now being used in Central Grand Council and is seriously being considered by Eastern Grand Council for their 3 top Officers. We are impressed with this collar and if we were to adopt it in Western Canada it would have the coat of arms of the 4 Western Provinces on the emblem at the bottom of the collar.

The cost of the American Collar with wholesale discount, custom and sales taxes would be approximately \$140.00 US funds. While cost of the Canadian one at present would be \$126.00. Both prices without jewels.

It is the recommendation of this committee that the Grand Council of Western Canada should adopt the Canadian context gold chain collar for the Grand Master, Grand Deputy Master, Grand Principal Conductor of the Work and Past Grand Masters, to be worn with the appropriate jewel as laid out in our Constitution. Such a recommendation would only entail changing Section 25 (B) and (C) in our Constitution if it were adopted.

Your committee would like to suggest that if our recommendation is accepted that 4 collars be purchased for next years installation for the 3 top officers and the immediate past Grand Master, and that one collar be purchased each year thereafter to invest the new P.C.W. who will wear it from there on, changing to the appropriate jewel each year.
